
5 Governance

- Communicate with stakeholders via social media, newsletters, phone calls, letters, & School Messenger. - Continue




STAR Reading Achievement Status

STAR Reading Data




NWEA Math Achievement Status

COUNSELORS/ADMINISTRATORS Social Emotional Supports

- Each counselor has been assigned a grade level
- Counselors will be meeting with groups of 3-4 students during their Lunch Bunch group
- Counselors asked teachers to complete grade level needs assessments. Time spent on Response Services (one-on-one counseling)
- Counselors have increased small groups (Community Partnership)
- RMS counselors and administrators work collaboratively with School Based Therapist (SBT), Student Assistance Meeting (SAM) and School Resource Officer (SRO), Tom Grisham to identify students in crisis
- Addition of Youth Behavior Health Liaison, Ashley Grisham to help connect families to services and interventions
- Assigned counselor and assistant principal for high intensity safety training (Midwest Safety Summit).
